### The Honorable Rosario Green, Inaugural Director

---



In January 2005, former Mexican Foreign Minister Rosario Green was appointed as the first director of the Kozmetsky Center. Green is a noted authority on subjects related to Mexican and Latin American economics and international politics. She served as the Secretary-General of the Partido Revolucionario Institucional (PRI), and as Senator in the Mexican Congress. She held faculty appointments at Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México, Center for International Studies at Colegio de México, and the Universidad Iberoamericana. Rosario Green studied International Affairs at Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México, and earned advanced degrees in economics from El Colegio de México and Columbia University.

## Dr. Elisa Díaz-Martínez

---



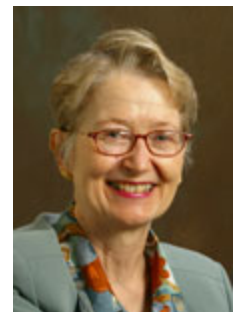
Dr. Elisa Díaz-Martínez served as Director of the Kozmetsky Center from 2009 to 2013. She holds a PhD in Social Sciences from Oxford University and the Juan March Institute in Madrid, and an MA from the Juan March Institute. Her areas of research and specialization focus on social inequalities, including health and education inequalities, and design and evaluation of public policies, particularly related to economic growth and sustainable development. Before coming to St. Edward's University, Díaz-Martínez spent five years as Senior Advisor in the Economic Bureau of the Spanish Prime Minister. She was responsible for advising the Prime Minister on policies related to economic growth and sustainable development such as social policy, health care, education and research and development. Díaz-Martínez has worked as a research fellow at University College London and taught undergraduate and graduate courses at Oxford University. She has published extensively in academic journals and other books, and served as a member of scientific committees at various academic institutions and think tanks, including Laboratorio Fundación Alternativas in Madrid. Díaz-Martínez was on the executive boards of SEPES, the Spanish public firm that manages state-owned land, and EFE, the leading Spanish language news agency.

## Dr. Margaret E. Crahan

Dr. Margaret E. Crahan served as Director of the Kozmetsky Center of Excellence in Global Finance and Kozmetsky Distinguished Professor from 2008-2009. She currently is Senior Fellow at the Center for the Study of Democracy, Toleration, and Religion at Columbia University. Crahan received her doctorate from Columbia University and has held a number of endowed chairs including:

- The Henry R. Luce Professorship of Religion, Power and Political Process at Occidental College (1982–1994)
- The Marous Professorship at the University of Pittsburgh (1993–1994)
- The Dorothy Epstein Professorship at Hunter College, City University of New York (1994–2008)



Crahan has served on the boards of the Fulbright Program and the Kellogg Institute of the University of Notre Dame, as well as a member of the Task Force on Latin America of the Council of Foreign Relations (2006–2008). She currently serves as Vice President of the Interamerican Institute of Human Rights and on the Executive Council of the Washington Office on Latin America. Crahan has published more than 100 books and articles.

## Dr. Joseph S. Tulchin

Dr. Joseph S. Tulchin was appointed interim director of the Kozmetsky Center of Excellence in Global Finance in 2006. His areas of expertise include U.S. foreign policy, inter-American relations,



contemporary Latin America, strategic planning and social science research methodology. Tulchin's publications include more than 100 scholarly articles and 70 books. Prior to his appointment, he served as the director of the Latin American Program at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars in Washington D.C., a position he held for more than 15 years. Before his tenure at the Woodrow Wilson International Center, Tulchin was a professor of History and director of the International Program at the University of North Carolina. He also taught History at Yale University.
